

How to Write Review Papers

The authors could follow the following comments if they want to rewrite their paper as a review paper:

- 1) The authors should review the literature more (in the second section, the first section is the introduction)
- 2) discuss all the main theories in the third section and discuss each main theory in each subsection of the third section;
- 3) discuss all the major methodologies of each main theory in the fourth section, and discuss each main methodology in each subsection of the fourth section;
- 4) Discuss some major applications for the theories and methodologies in the fifth section, and discuss the major applications for each theory and methodology in each subsection of the fifth section for the topic they studied in their paper; and
- 5) The authors should list some very important papers in the area(s) of their study that have been published in top journals and tell the readers what the main contributions of their paper are that do better than the papers published in top journals. They should write the above in a separate report so that the editor could know what their contribution is over and above the papers published in top journals. If the authors cannot list any top journals' papers related to their work, this could mean that their study is not important. In this case, we cannot publish their paper.

If the authors want to write a review paper but do not want to follow the above, they could write a separate note and tell the editor their view that their review paper is a very good review paper that many authors will read and cite. If we believe what the author said is true, we could consider publishing the paper.
