How to present the findings and draw inferences from the findings?

- 1) The authors should discuss more on their findings and draw more inferences from their findings, e.g.
- a) The authors have presented some tables (e.g. Tables 3 and 5) but have not discussed the findings from the tables, and
- b) The authors have presented some tables (e.g. Tables 2 and 4) and have had little discussions after the tables.
- . This is not acceptable. The authors should discuss the findings for each table after presenting the tables. The authors should draw more inferences from the findings in each table.
- c) The authors have made little discussion about Table 1 before presenting Table 1 but they have not made any discussion for the findings from Table 1.

This is not a good way of presentation. A better way is that the authors should tell readers what they are going to present in Table 1, then present Table 1, and discuss the findings from Table 1 after presenting the table.
